

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

Under graduate: Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination of 10+2 pattern conducted by the Government of TN, AISSC, DSSC, CBSE - New Delhi and ICSE - New Delhi are eligible to apply.

CURRICULAR PROGRAMME

Each academic year shall be divided into two semesters. The odd semester shall consist of the period from June to November of each year and the even semester from December to April of each year. There shall be not less than 90 working days for each semester.

The main subject of Study for Bachelor Degree Course shall consist of the following:

PART - I TAMIL/HINDI/FRENCH

PART - II ENGLISH

PART - III CORE SUBJECTS

ALLIED SUBJECTS

PROJECT/ ELECTIVES WITH THREE COURSES

PART- IV

1. (a) Students who have not studied Tamil up to XII Standard and taken a Non-Tamil Language under Part-I shall take Basic Tamil comprising two courses (level will be at 6th Standard).

(b) Students who have studied Tamil up to XII Std. and taken a Non-Tamil Language under Part-I shall take Advanced Tamil comprising two courses.

(c) Students who do not come under (a) or (b) can choose non-major elective comprising two courses.
2. Skill based subjects (elective) - (Soft Skills).
3. Environmental Studies.
4. Value Education.

PART - V EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

A Candidate shall be awarded a maximum of 1 credit for compulsory Extension Service.

All the Students have to enrol for NSS / NCC / Sports and Games/ Rotaract/ Youth Red Cross or any other Service Organizations in the college and have to put in Compulsory minimum attendance of 120 hours which shall be duly certified by the Principal of the college every year. If a student lacks 120 hour of attendance in the First year he/she shall have to compensate the same during the subsequent years. Literacy and Population Education Field Work shall be compulsory components in the above extension service activities.

EVALUATION

During the course of study, the evaluation of a candidate will be based on both Continuous Assessment (Internal Assessment) and the End Semester Examination Weighing 25% and 75% respectively.

PASSING MINIMUM

There shall be no passing minimum for internal. For the external examination, passing minimum shall be 40% for UG.

The Internal Assessment will have attendance as a component.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance rules as per University norms

The Candidates admitted from 2003-2004 shall be permitted to proceed to next semester and complete the course after producing MC by authorized medical attendant. They have to repeat the semester which they have missed by rejoining after the completion of final semester
5.	E	55% instead of 65% for married women	Married women if they conceive during their academic career can appear for examination by producing MC from Doctor attached to government hospital and by paying condonation fee.

REQUIREMENTS FOR PROCEEDING TO THE SUBSEQUENT SEMESTER

Candidates shall register their names for the first semester examination after admission to the courses.

Candidates shall be permitted to proceed from the first semester up to the final semester irrespective of their failure in any of the semester examination subject to the condition that the candidates should register for all the arrear subjects of the earlier semesters along with the current semester subjects.

ELIGIBILITY FOR THE AWARD OF DEGREE

A candidate shall be eligible for the award of degree only if he/she has undergone the prescribed course of study in a college affiliated to the University for a period of not less than three academic years, and passed the examinations of all the six semesters prescribed earning 140 credits(in part I, II, III, IV & V)

CLASSIFICATION OF SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES

(I)PART I/II/III: Successful candidates passing the examinations and securing (i) 60 percent and above and (ii) 50 percent and above but below 60 percent in the aggregate shall be declared to have passed the examination in the FIRST and SECOND class, respectively. All other successful candidates shall be declared to have passed the examination in the THIRD class.

(ii) PART- IV

Successful candidates shall be declared to have passed the examination on earning the credits prescribed.

(iii) PART-V EXTENSION ACTIVITIES:

Successful candidates earning the prescribed credit SHALL BE eligible for Classification/Ranking/Distinction.

RANKING:

Candidates who pass all the examinations prescribed for the course in the FIRST APPEARANCE ALONE are eligible for Ranking/Distinction.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

GENERAL DISCIPLINE

- All students should be present on the reopening and last working day of each semester.
- Students should confine themselves to the classroom during class hours. They can visit the library only during the allotted hours and can go to canteen only during the breaks.
- Students should maintain decorum and discipline inside the classrooms.
- Students are strictly prohibited from entering the office room. They will transact all business across the counter.
- Students indulging in Ragging will be issued TC immediately.
- Students indulging in:
 - Malpractices/misconduct
 - Usage of mobile phones and camera / Misuse and damage to college property
 - Organizing / Participating in unions/ association /any undesirable activities within the campus
 - Smoking, consumption of alcohol/drugs or any

DRESS CODE

- **The dress code for girls is Salwar Kameez/ Churidar Kurta with dupatta neatly pinned (Short Churidar and Tights to be avoided).**
- **Formal Trousers / Jeans with Formal Shirt / Collared Plain T-Shirts and shoes for the boys. They are expected to present a formal, neat appearance (clean –shaven, well-trimmed hair).**
- **All the students must wear the College Identity Card inside the campus at all times.**

LEAVE RULES

- **Students should not take leave without prior permission from the Class In-charge.**
- **Leave of more than three days must be reported with a valid medical certificate.**
- **Absence for a single period will entail absence for half-a-day.**

COLLEGE FEES

- **College fees for the entire academic year to be paid either as a single payment in June or as 2 instalments (June & November)**

on or before the prescribed date failing which a fine will be levied.

- In case of prolonged delay, the student's name will be removed from the roll call and he/she will have to be readmitted.

Library Rules

- Strict silence must be maintained in the Library.
- Each student will be provided with two borrower's ticket, upon which he/she can borrow the library books.
- Students are allowed to keep the borrowed books for a period of 15 days.
- Books must not be marked or damaged in any manner.
- Books must be returned on or before the due date, failing which a fine of Rs. 2 per day will be collected.
- Loss of any book should be immediately reported to the librarian in the prescribed form available in the library. Students shall replace or pay the cost of any book lost by them.
- A fine of Rs. 100 will be charged towards the loss of a borrower's ticket.
- Reference books and Journals will not be issued.

TRANSPORTATION

The bus service is available to transport students and faculty.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Students shall opt for the bus service in the beginning of the year by paying the annual fee in advance.
- Students should carry their bus identity card always and produce it when demanded by the staff in-charge.
- Loss of the identity card should be reported and duplicate card will be issued on payment of Rs. 60.

- **Strict discipline and decorum should be maintained inside the buses.**

Note: The College reserves the rights to withdraw the bus identity card in case of undesirable activities by the students.

TWO-WHEELER PARKING FACILITIES

Students must possess the two-wheeler driving license to use two wheelers as their mode of conveyance to the college. The vehicles must be parked in the allotted parking space.
